Registering Children Aged 5 and Under

Dear Parent or Guardian

When returning a registration form for a child aged 5 or under please can we ask you to send photographs of the relevant immunisation pages from their Red Book.



This is so that we can ensure that all childhood immunisations are accurately recorded in your child's record. We often find that, even when vaccinations have been given, they are not properly recorded. Thank you for your assistance. An example of an immunisation page that we need you to photograph or scan is shown below.

We need you to send copies of between one & three pages depending on the age of your child. The table below shows which of the pages that we need to see.

If you have recently arrived in the UK and do not yet have a red book we would ask that you provide any official documentation of vaccinations for our nursing team to review. Where these are comparable with the UK immunisation schedule we can record them in your child's record. Where they are not a member of the nursing team will contact you to discuss the options.

Thank you for your assistance with this. It will help to ensure that you child is fully vaccinated according to the UK immunisation schedule and will save the practice a significant amount of administrative work trying to establish the correct immunisation record.
